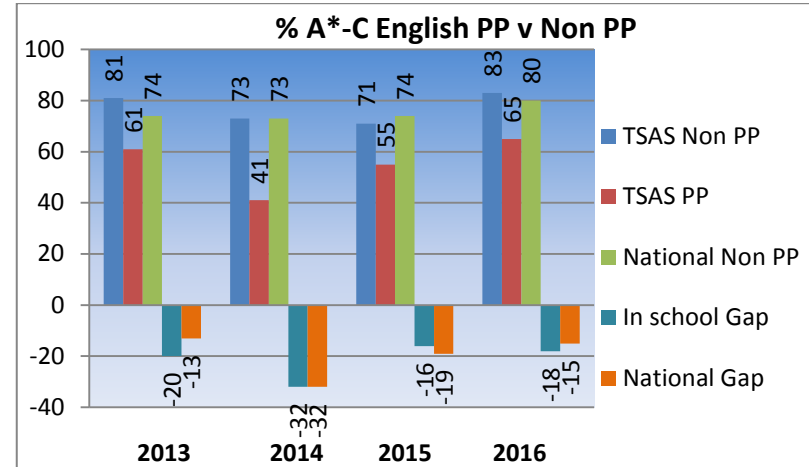
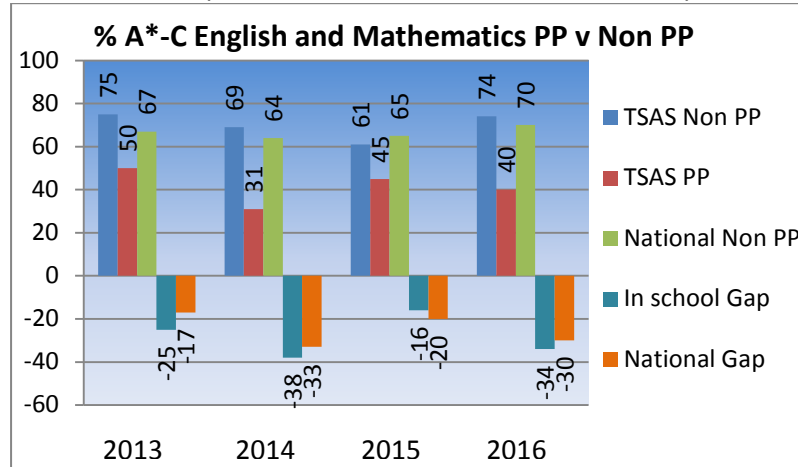


Pupil Premium Impact – 2015/2016

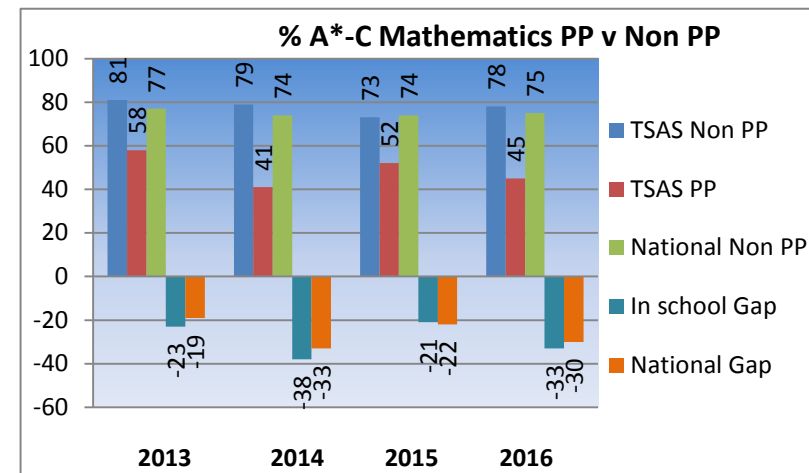
The graphs show the impact of the Pupil Premium allocations on narrowing the gap in attainment and progress.

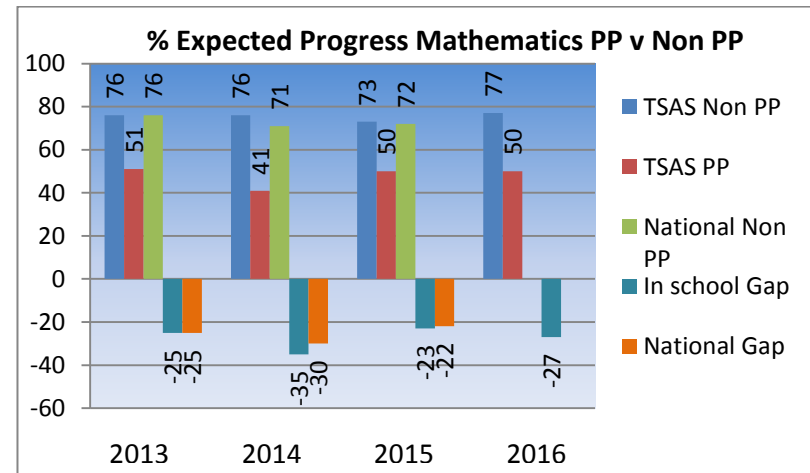
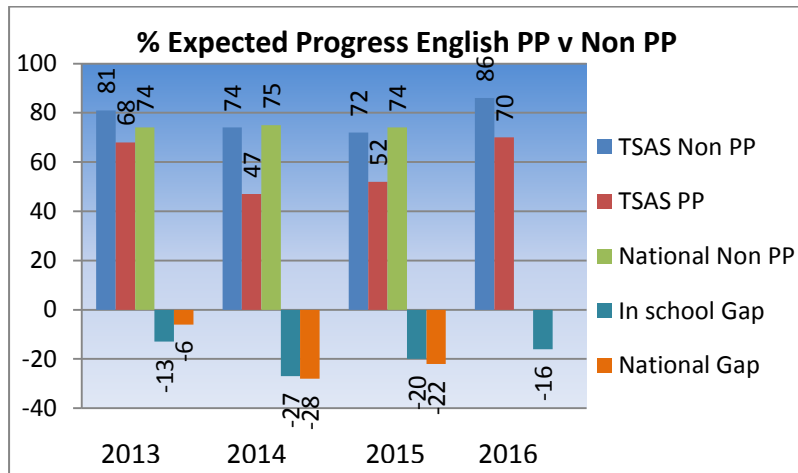
The graph below shows the percentage of students attaining Grades A*-C in both English and Mathematics over a four year period. The figures represent results of the Pupil Premium students versus the Non Pupil Premium students at school level and at National Level.

The graphs above demonstrate the percentage of students making 3 Levels or more progress in English and Mathematics v the National groups. There is not a National measure in 2016 as it ceased to be a Nationally reported figure in 2016. Expected Progress has now been replaced with the Progress 8 and Attainment 8 measure.
