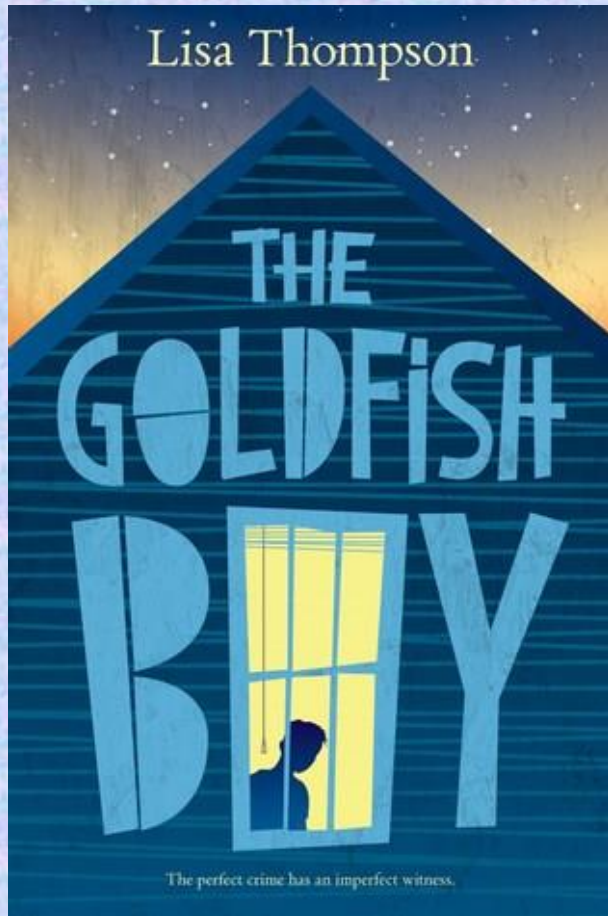


The Goldfish Boy
