In **Spanish,** students will learn how to give information about themselves and talk about their favourite things.

Spring Term

In French, students will learn to give opinions on their school subjects. They will talk about their school day and also say what they eat at lunch. Students will learn about school life in a French speaking country.

In **German**, students will learn how to describe their family, friends and pets. They will learn to talk about appearance and personality and give opinions on people. They will also talk about where people live and where they are from.

In **Spanish**, students learn how to introduce their family and friends. They will learn how to give a description of In French, this unit provides an opportunity to expand students' knowledge of opinions. Their number work is reinforced and extended by learning how to tell the time. Food, which students began their French learning adventure with, is reviewed and extended in this unit. Students develop their knowledge of regular and irregular verbs and also start to produce longer texts / speech independently.

In **German**, this unit provides an opportunity to revisit vocabulary from the previous module, before developing more detailed descriptions. Students will also learn important verbs and how to create longer sentences. Using information familiar to the students means they can concentrate on beginning to understand verbs and other grammar constructions.

In French, students study the film Vie de Chat; a superb traditional animation which provides a bridge between the work done on personal and family description in Y7 and prepares learners for their work on town and Paris which are covered in Y8.

In **German** the year will end with a film study of 'Das Wunder von Bern'. This film tells the story of the 1954 Football World Cup and gives students insights into life in Germany after WW2.

In Spanish, students will study the film 'Los Futbolísimos'. Los Futbolísimos follows a school football team of 11-year-olds in Spain. They are near the bottom of the league and facing being replaced by a choir if they do not win a game. The team must come together to unravel the mystery, in the process discovering what it means to be a successful team.
