
We advertise these clubs and activities through each Year Group's Google Classroom. Each activity will have its own classroom as well, so that teachers can share information with students about the club.

I am sure that every one of you are familiar with our ClassCharts approach to sharing live information with you about how your child is doing in class.



use of the school's Rewards and Sanctions system and I want to share some revisions with you.

- 1. We have shared with staff their overall ClassCharts usage data, highlighting the staff that use the system particularly effectively in rewarding the display of positive behaviours and focussed effort by students.
- 2. We are supporting staff who have experienced barriers to the effective use of the ClassCharts system, for example IT issues or their personal technical knowhow.
- 3. We are looking carefully at our rewards system and how the accumulation of positive points can best be rewarded, through both badges and certificates but also through extra freedoms and privileges.
- 4. We have identified six common behaviours that can loosely be termed as unproductive, disruptive or disrespectful. Obviously we do not want these behaviours to influence the performance of any child or their classmates.
- 5. To reduce the display of such behaviours, we have this week been discussing them with students and explaining how from Monday 26 September 2022, we will be robustly responding to their display through the issuing of a negative point. An afterschool reflection focused on the impact of such behaviours will result should any student be issued five or more such 'no negation' negatives in one day.

We do need your support with this, in both praising your child when they receive positives and also in explaining to them why any negative behaviours that are identified on ClassCharts should be avoided in the future.



Language Rocks - The European Day of Languages (EDL) is celebrated across Europe on 26 September every year. It aims to promote the rich linguistic diversity of Europe and raise awareness of the importance of lifelong language learning for everyone. It was set up by the Council of Europe and was first celebrated in 2001.

Languages are an increasingly important part of the curriculum at Thorpe St Andrew School and Sixth Form, as more and more students take the ebacc route in their GCSE studies. We want students to be equipped with the skills and mindset to thrive in a multicultural world. We are very proud of the excellent results achieved by our GCSE cohorts in French, German and Spanish. We are also delighted to see our first cohort of Year 13 Spanish students perform so brilliantly in their examinations.

To mark EDL, we want to remind students that 'MFL rocks!' During next week, students on the North Site should keep their eyes peeled for language-themed painted



rocks. Anyone finding a rock, should take it to an MFL teacher where it will be exchanged for a small prize. There will also be a language-related activity during Friday form time.
