### **Introduction:**

Welcome to the inaugural curriculum enhancement week at Thorpe St Andrew School and Sixth Form.

Curriculum enhancement week involves a tremendous amount of effort. It is made possible because of the outstanding collective effort of the school staff, who in some cases give up their free time in order to offer our students the most incredible experiences.

For three days from Tuesday 18th June to Thursday 20th June, all lessons will be suspended and all staff and students will spend these 3 days pursuing one of the many activities detailed in this booklet.

Students will opt for one of our many amazing clusters, these include in school options, out of school trips and some clusters which contain a combination of in school days and out of school days. We also have several residentials happening (these may leave earlier due to lasting more than 3 days).

### Our main aims of curriculum enhancement week:

- Enable students to try something new beyond our broad academic curriculum.
- Encourage students to learn and use additional skills that may not be fully developed in the academic curriculum.
- To strengthen the working relationships between student and teacher.
- To give students the opportunity to show leadership skills in different settings.

All students in year 7 to 10 are required to take part in curriculum enhancement week, in line with the school policy, **holiday is not authorised during curriculum enhancement week**.

### How to choose an activity:

- Read through this booklet carefully.
- Students are to choose 3 clusters in order of preference. This year we are offering a large number of clusters, it may not always be possible to allocate every students' first choice, so please select two other clusters that you feel you would also enjoy.
- Students cluster preferences must be completed on the google form -<u>Curriculum Enhancement Week Preferences Form</u>
- The deadline for completing the google form is **Monday 6th November**.

### Payments:

Following the preferences process closing and students being allocated an activity, parents/carers will be sent a letter confirming their child's allocated cluster. This letter will contain information as to what payments are required and when.

Every activity, unless free of charge, will require a deposit on or before the 8th of December. The full balance for activities must be paid by Thursday 18th April 2024. Prices shown in the preference booklet are approximations based on the full number of students participating in the activity, therefore they are subject to a slight change.

A cluster may be withdrawn if it is no longer financially viable. We offer a wide range of clusters including low cost and free clusters which should satisfy those who do not wish to pay a larger amount.

Payments must be made via parent pay, we are unable to accept cash or cheques for any activities.

Please be aware that should your child fall ill or for any other reason decides that they do not want to go on the trip, the school insurance will not cover this. No refund will be given unless a replacement student takes their place.

### **Support with payments:**

We are delighted to say that those students, who are pupil premium, have 50% of the cost of non residential trips, covered by the school.

For students wishing to attend a residential trip. where parents/guardians believe you may be eligible for support due to being on a low income, whether working and/or receiving benefits, we have a couple of charities that can be contacted for support.

# Exploring the Battlefields of World War One: France and Belgium

Beginning in Belgium and then travelling into France, we will be visiting some of the key battlefield sites of the First World War, including Croonaert Wood, Flanders Fields, Sanctuary Wood, and the Hooge Crater. We will be spending time at the Langemark Cemetery and British Tyne Cot Ceremony. You will have the opportunity to explore these sites with a designated information guide. This will include museum visits, tours of German and Allied trenches, and the Menin Gate Last Post Ceremony. We will be staying in accommodation in Ypres, giving us excellent access to the key First World War historical sites. If you are a keen historian, with a particular interest in military history, or you are interested in taking GCSE History, this trip will provide a fantastic introduction to our unit The British Sector of the Western Front, as we will study many of these locations in Year 10.

In particular, using Modroc to create an arm cast, and to look at artists to inspire how we can decorate them. You can keep a cast of your arm/hand as a memory of this activity.


Overall, we promise one thing: you will have lots of fun, and a chance to be creative!

### The Motorsports Experience Challenge

A three day motorsports extravaganza for all of those petrol heads out there.

On day 1 students will experience an introduction to petrol powered karting at "East Anglia's Leading Outdoor Circuit.

Day 2 will see a visit to the home of British Motorsport Silverstone and it's museum. Focusing on STEM and History, we aim to bring learning to life and inspire the next generation of engineers. In addition to the main exhibition & visit to the heritage track trail, students will enjoy a 45 minute workshop led by one of the Silverstone Museum facilitators in their dedicated learning studio.

Day 3 will involve students participating in an introduction to F1 in schools. Students will have the opportunity to work with an experienced "F1 in schools" ambassador to give students an insight into the skills that are needed to be successful in motorsport.

Students will create their own F1 style model, and race against the clock to see which students have the best design. Students will also have the opportunity to put their karting skills that they learned earlier in the week to good use with the Xbox Forza Motorsport simulator racing challenge (racing for the fastest lap around a virtual Silverstone circuit).

## **The MFL Experience**


Come and join us for three amazing days of MFL themed activities. The days will be split into different sessions including:

Over the top trenches and Homefront shelter building.


If you are interested in History and want to see History in ways that cannot be incorporated into lesson time. This is the cluster for you.

### **Active Animation**


Do you want to recreate scenes from Star Wars or the end of Deathly Hallows with Lego?
