Attendance Matters - #WeAREHere

With the whole school focusing on the importance of being kind, we looked at the impact of bullying behaviours on students' attendance. We found that research carried out by the Red Balloon foundation suggests as many as 3.4% of the whole student population take time away from school because they feel vulnerable. We take all allegations of bullying seriously, following up on each report and addressing the bullying behaviour just as much as we support the targeted student.



85% of students felt safe at Thorpe from the latest parent survey and in Year 7, 86% have not experienced any bullying since joining us.

We are encouraging our students at Thorpe St Andrew School and Sixth Form to be intolerant of these bullying behaviours, as they are preventing others from accessing all that we have to offer in school. Kindness, whether it is a smile, a welcoming hello, or an offer of help, can make all the difference to someone's day.

In our Monday Assembly presentation, we showcased some of the achievements of our Thorpe St Andrew School and Sixth Form students. Thorpe is a remarkably diverse community and we have celebrated achievements in every field of human endeavour. In the assembly, we focused on but a few:

- The student who has become a professional actor, appearing in TV shows, and on stage in the West End (in the Harry Potter stage show)
- The students who play their sport at every level, including those who have gone to National Championships
- The students who have used their artistic skills to enrich our school and local community
- The students who have brought their home culture into our Food Rooms, whether for a Bake-off or in their GCSE practicals
- The student who had to use a wheelchair to get around school but who overcame his difficulties and went on to University to study Sociology
- The students who have made the most of their practical skills and gone on to apprenticeships in the trades, including the student who secured an apprenticeship as a boat-builder.



All these students are remembered and celebrated by the school - there is room at Thorpe for everyone. We had to note that not every Thorpe student is as accepting as we would like but we work hard to help them to have a more inclusive attitude. With our "Be Kind" focus, we want every student to feel a part of our community and we encourage everyone to be kind to each other.

This week, we have been looking at the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, which was adopted by the UN General Assembly on 10 December 1948. 
